In the fairy tale format author Gayle Grass uses a perfect blend of fantasy to take the reader on a journey through a child's experiences in living with ADHD. From the child's perspective we are introduced to the frustrations, problems and discouraging experiences at school and at home. Skippy's restlessness and daydreaming attempt to block out the distractions around her are constantly getting her in trouble at school. Her difficulty in concentrating on the task at hand long enough to complete it is causing poor grades at school. Her problems at school are combining to make it difficult to go to school.
